

# Soy sourcing data

**Bunge is committed to eliminating deforestation throughout our supply chains by 2025. We have been regularly disclosing progress on our industry leading non-deforestation commitment since 2016 (read our [7th progress report here](#)), and we fully support broader industry engagement through the Soft Commodities Forum.**

For 2019, we achieved over 93% traceability for direct source farms in the 25 priority municipalities in the Cerrado, as presented below. Considering our 98% direct sourcing in the region, our data provide a high level of confidence that good governance practices are in place. We are continuously enhancing our traceability by engaging with our direct

and indirect suppliers using environmental registry data and other sources. We also actively develop new tools and incentives that support sustainable agricultural expansion, such as the open-source planning tool, [Agroideal.org](#), and an innovative financing mechanism offering long-term loans to farmers willing to commit to sustainable agriculture.

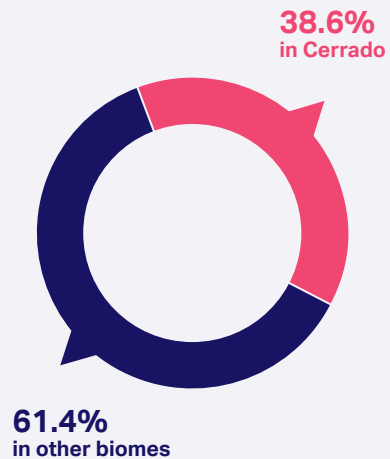

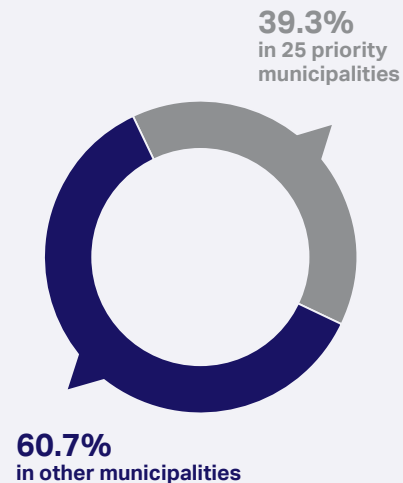

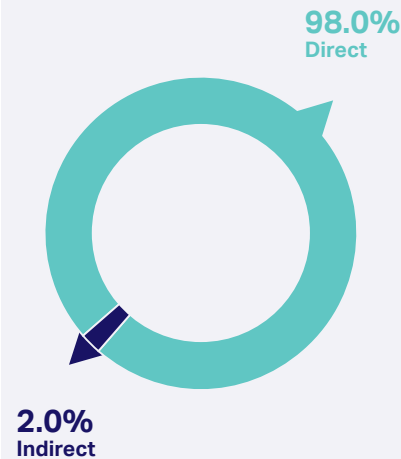
### Soy volume sourced in Brazil



### Soy volume sourced in Cerrado

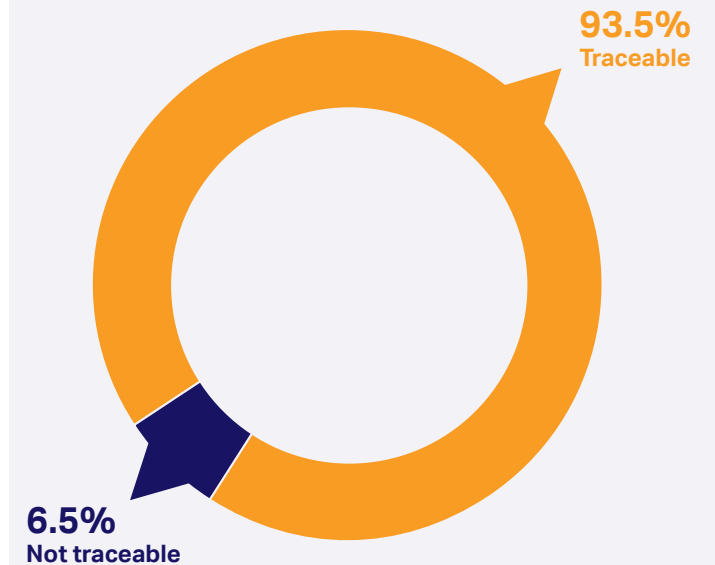


### Soy volume sourced in 25 priority municipalities in Cerrado
